

Town of St. Paul, Indiana

During the week of September 22, 2025, Robinson Pipe Cleaning Company will be in town to clean and televise sanitary sewers throughout St. Paul. The work will take place in sections of town marked in red on the attached map. This process is necessary to maintain and improve the sewer system, ensuring reliable service for residents and businesses. Crews will use high-pressure water jets to clean the pipes, followed by camera inspections to assess their condition.

As the cleaning hose passes by your home's service connection, the jetting action may cause air to travel through your plumbing. This could result in minor water disturbances around floor drains or toilets, especially if plumbing ventilation in your home is limited. To help minimize any inconvenience, keep toilet lids closed and ensure all drains have water in their traps. If odors occur, simply pour about a half-gallon of water into each fixture to restore the water barrier in the traps.

In some cases, residents may notice slow drains if roots within the service line hold debris from the cleaning process. Crews will take steps to reduce issues by venting manholes and using the lowest water pressure necessary. These temporary inconveniences are normal and short-lived, but your cooperation—such as checking drains and keeping lids closed—will help make the process smoother for everyone.
