Good afternoon, Alyssa.

Based on the pictures, it does appear that portions of the railroad corridor that are not being actively maintained by the Town have become heavily overgrown with vegetation, brush, and small trees. In several of the photographs, the railroad right-of-way appears significantly obstructed and generally unmaintained. At the same time, the photographs also demonstrate that the portions being mowed and maintained by the Town are visibly distinguishable from the areas that are not.

My recommendation would be to provide formal written notice to the railroad requesting that it address the overgrowth and maintenance concerns. The photographs you provided should be helpful for that purpose. Please let me know if you have any questions or would like to discuss further. I will stand by for further guidance from the Town Council following its consideration of the matter at the June Town Council meeting.
